



HARVEY GEORGE BEAN, D.D.S., E.D.

Born at Islington, he received his early education at West Toronto School and HumberSide Collegiate. Entered R.C.D.S. in 1914, but in 1916, he enlisted as a private in the 198th Canadian Buffs Battalion.

He transferred to the Canadian Dental Corps, and served overseas with the rank of Sergeant until December, 1917, when he was sent home to complete his Dental Course. He Graduated from R.C.D.S. in 1919.

He Was on the staff of the Dental College, Toronto, for four years, commencing in 1921, and was for a time associated with Dr. George Grieve in the practice of Orthodontia. In 1922, he began practice in his own office, specializing in orthodontia.

Between World War I and World War II, he remained in Military Affairs, serving first as Lieutenant under Col. Charles A. Corrigan, D.S.O., in the Canadian Army Service Corps until 1925. In 1928, he transferred to the Medical Corps as Dental Officer, with the rank of Captain. When World War II broke out, he enlisted, and was promoted to the rank of Major, and when Col. W.G. Trelford, V.D., went overseas, he took command as District Dental Officer, M.D.2 with the rank of Lt. Col. He went overseas in 1942 to the end of the war.

He is an Honorary Life Member of the American Association of Orthodontists, a member of the Toronto Academy of Dentistry, the only Canadian ever elected to the Southern Society of Orthodontists, a member of the American Board of Orthodontists, and Past President of the Great Lakes Orthodontic Society. He is a fellow of the International College of Dentists, and a life member of the Ontario Dental Association, and the Art Gallery, Toronto.
