BASIL GLOVER BIBBY. D.M.D. PhD. B.D.S. (N.Z.)

Born in Waipawa, New Zealand, in 1904.

Graduated from Otago University, N.Z., with a B.D.S. degree in 1927.

Was an instructor in operative dentistry at Otago University, and engaged in private practice before coming to Rochester in 1930.

From 1930-33, he was the Rockefeller Dental Fellow at the University of Rochester, and from 1934-35, he held a Senior Rockefeller Dental Fellowship at the same university.

From 1936-1940, he was Assistant professor of Dentistry at the School of Medicine and Dentistry, University of Rochester.

He left there to become associated with Tufts College Dental School in Boston, of which he became Dean of the Dental School and professor of bacteriology in the Medical School in 1940.

He was appointed Director of the Eastman Dental Dispensery in Rochester in June, 1947.

He was elected president of the Pan American Odontological Association in 1947.

He presented papers before the International Association for Dental Research and the A.A.D.S. in 1946.

He was awarded the Benjamin Lord Prize by the First District Dental Society of the State of New York in 1935 for his paper "The formation of salivary calculus"

He is married to an American girl, and has three daughters and one son.
