



JOHN FRANKLIN BLAIR, D.D.S., D.S.O.

Graduated from the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario in 1908, and for some years practised in Winnipeg and Southern Saskatchewan.

In 1915, he went overseas as Dental Officer with the Fourth Field Ambulance, attached to the Second Division, and remained in France until December of 1918, at which time he went to Germany. Later he returned to England and was Senior Dental Officer at Bramshott and Ripon and later A.D.D.S. for the Seaforth Area. He became a Major in 1917, and was mentioned in despatches. He was awarded the D.S.O. in 1918, and was decorated by King George V at Buckingham Palace. He returned to London, Ontario in 1919.

He is Past President of the London Dental Society, a member of the C.D.C. Committee of the C.D.A. and has always taken an active interest in organised dentistry.

He is an Anglican, a member of the Highland Golf Club, and an enthusiastic golfer.
