Born May 7, 1902, and received his early education at Carleton Park P Public and High Schools.

Taught school for one year in Alberta and then entered the Royal College of Dental Surgeons, graduating in 1929. He was awarded a Fellowship and received his degree of B.Sc.(Dent.) in 1930.
