Since 1936 has been associated with the University of Pennsylvania School of Dentistry as instructor in oral diagnosis 1937-41, assistant professor of oral medicine 1941-44, and as professor of oral medicine since 1944.

Director of the Ivory Cross Expedition to Holland in 1946.

Chief of Oral Medicine at Philadelphia General Hospital.

Consultant to Army, Navy and Veterans administration.

Appointed Dean, University of Pennsylvania School of Dentistry in 1951.

Appointed honorary member of the Philadelphia Society of Periodontology in 1954.

Appointed honorary member of the American Academy of Dental Medicine in 1954.

Author of the text "Oral Medicine".

Contributed over seventy articles to dental literature.

Special studies include: oral pathology, focal infection, transient bacteremias and oral diagnosis.
