



GEORGE LYNCH CAMERON, D.D.S., L.D.S., D.S.O., V.D., O.B.E., M.D.S.

Graduated in dentistry from McGill University in 1908 with a D.D.S., and received his M.D.S. from the same University.

He practised in Swift Current, Saskatchewan, and was Alderman of that city from 1909 until 1914.

He is Past President of the Swift Current Dental Society, the Saskatchewan College of Dental Surgeons, the Western Canada Dental Society, the Canadian Dental Association (1935), and the Hospital Board of Swift Current.

He is Past Grand Master, I.O.O.F. (Sask.): 1916-1917; Chairman of the Swift Current Collegiate and Public School Boards, 1926-1936; He has been a member of the Educational Council of Saskatchewan since 1914, and a member of the Senate of the University of Saskatchewan since 1939. He was President of the Swift Current Rotary Club, 1932-1933, and is an Honorary Member of the British Dental Association.

World War I: He served as second in command of the First Battalion, C.E.F., Canadian Infantry, and was wounded in 1918, mentioned in despatches and awarded the D.S.O. in 1918.

In 1935, he was awarded the Colonial Officer's Long Service Decoration (V.D.)

World War 2: In August, 1939, he was appointed District Dental Officer, M.D.12, when the Canadian Dental Corps was formed. Later, he relinquished this appointment on being reposted to the C.D.C. Headquarters at Ottawa, May 22, 1940. In March, 1941, he was made Deputy Director of Dental Services at Ottawa. In 1943, he was promoted to the rank of Colonel.

In 1944 he was awarded the Order of the British Empire.

He is a Mason, a Presbyterian, and his hobbies are shooting, curling, golf, education and soldiering.

In 1948, he was Special Dental Advisor, Dept. of Veteran's Affairs, Ottawa.

In 1948, he was awarded a Fellowship in The International College of Dentists.
