Dr. J. Menzies Campbell was born in 1887, he was educated at George Watson's College, Edinburgh and Anderson's College Medical School, Glasgow, etc,

After becoming a Licentiate in Dental Surgery of the Royal Faculty of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow, he proceeded to the University of Toronto, where he graduated D.D.S. (Cum laude) in 1912.

Besides being on the roll of the Fellows of the Royal Society of Edinburgh (a highly prized honor), he is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine, Honorary Member of the Pierre Fauchard Academy, a Member of the International Dental Federation and other learned societies. He is a past president of the Odonto-Chirurgical Society of Scotland (founded 1867) - today, the oldest dental society still functioning under its original title.

Dr. Campbell read, by invitation, two papers at the Villth International Dental Congress, Paris, 1931. He was, in 1930, one of the six signatories (the others being Sir Norman Bennett, Sir Harry Baldwin, Dr. William Guy, Dr. J. H. Badcock and Dr. William Hern) to the National Manifest on Dental Disease.

He is British Correspondent to Dental Items of Interest and the Journal of the Canadian Dental Association. His hobby is dental history, including collecting early dental books and instruents.
