- Adams, Marston E. Mayor of Magog, Que. (J.C.D.A. 1951, p. 229)
- Allen, George P., Mount Forest, Ontario. Mayor for 9 years and on School Board for many years. (1948: 583)
- Armitage, George Guelph, Sherbrook, Que. Elected to the Council of the Town of Montreal West in 1933 and served for 8 years as Commissioner in charge of the Police and Fire Departments. (1958: 734)
- Armstrong, Ernest Frederick, Cobalt, Ontario. Mayor for 3 terms; 1914, 1922, 1925. 1925-26 he represented his constituency in the House of Commons. (1948: 230)
- Armstrong, Milton Taylor (d. 1958), Parry Sound, Ontario. Elected as a Liberal Candidate for the Provincial House, 1934 and served as a member for District for 12 years. During his 12 years in Parliament he was Chairman of the Library Board of the Parliament Bldgs and one of the Parliamentary whips. He was an ardent Liberal and won every Provincial convention of the Liberal Party for 25 years. (1958: 44)
- Barron, Frederick. Mayor of the Town of Paris, Ontario for 1933. (Oral Health 1932)
- Bedingfield, Howard Ernest, High River, Alta. Served in the 20's as mayor of the town. (1957: 669)
- Bell, John Wycliffe. Hamilton, Chairman of the Board of Education for the City of Hamilton. (Oral Health 1933, p. 76)
- Benson, Auriel E., Essex, Ontario. Served many years on the Public School Board, was an ex-councillor and was mayor of Essex in 1931-32. (1959: 325)
- Bernard, Aldis. Elected councillor for the Montreal Centre Ward in 1858, mayor of Montreal 1873.
- Berry, Richard N., Caledonia. In the Town council for a number of yrs. and Warden of Haldimand County in 1923. He was also a provincial member of Parliament for two terms. (1957: 312)
- Black, D.A. of Kingston. Served as Alderman for two years. (1945: 144)
- Black, H. Walter, Sidney, N.S. Served on the City Parks Commission as Chairman. (1949: 405)
- Blanchard, James Edward, Charlottetown, P.E.I. Mayor, 1944-46, previous to this,

served on the city council for nearly 20 years. (1961:52)

Bliss, H. C. Ontario representative of the Canadian Conservation Assoc.

Bower, Ira, Ottawa. Alderman of Ottawa City council 1910-12. (1949:54)

Box, H.K. Honorary Consultant to the Dept. of Health and Oral Hygiene for the Province of Ontario.

Box, Willard McConnell, Toronto. Progressive Conservative Candidate for Spadina in 1949, unsuccessfully opposed David Croll for the Spadina Commons seat. (1958)

Boyd, D.M. President of the board of trade.

Bradley, Frederick Hamilton, Sherbrooke, Quebec. Mayor of Sherbrooke in 1934 and 1935, represented the North Ward in the City Council for years. (1947:554)

Brass, James, Ontario. Mayor of Hanley, Sask for 2 years around 1907 and elected to the Collegiate Board of Yorkton in 1921, served 27 years, 23 of which he was chairman.

Broderick, William P., Saint John, N.B. Ran for Dominion Parliament in 1917 and in 1921 on the Liberal platform, but was defeated on both occasions.

Brown, H.K. Once member of the Alberta Provincial Legislature.

Brown, Richard N.C., Assiniboia, Sask. Member of the town council for a number of years. (1957:359)

Cameron, George Lynch, Swift Current. A councillor and alderman, an Executive Member of the Provincial and Dominion Liberal Association. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 348) (1958:367)

Campbell, G. Harold, Orangeville. 25 Years as councillor, Deputy-Reeve, Reeve, Mayor and Hydro Commissioner. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 428)

- Campbell, L.G., Markdale, Ontario. Served on the Municipal Council of Markdale and was the Conservative candidate for the Southeast Grey federal elections of 1925, 1930 and 1935. (1957: 49)
- Cavanagh, William B. Mayor of Cornwall, Ontario in 1906-26. (J.C.D.A. 1956; 436)
- Caza, Joseph E., Huntington, Que. Alderman of the Huntington Town Council. (1959:265)
- Clark, E.H. Minnedosa, Man. Served as mayor for 10 years and member of council for a total of 25 years.
- Cleave, Paul. Member of Meepawa, Man. town council for 23 years, 5 years as mayor. (J.C.D.A. 1955, p. 429)
- Cleveland, Edward Thomas, Montreal. Alderman on the town council. (CDAJ 1949:663)
- Conboy, F.J. Mayor of Toronto, 1940-1944, member of council 1935-44, 2 years as alderman, 4 years controller.
- Conley, Frederick Joseph. 1935, alderman of the city of Toronto, then Controller for 4 years, then mayor for 4 years. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 346)
- Cowan, Walter D., born in Ontario. Mayor of Regina 1916-17. Conservative member of Parliament in Union Gov't of Sir. Robert Borden. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 341)
- Coupland, Percy Thayer. Served on town council in St. Mary's for 5 years, was mayor in 1914. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 720)
- Croll, Hubert A., Souris, Man. (d. 1957) Served on the Souris School Board and the town council. (1957:544)
- Davey, Dr. Alderman, also Medical Officer of Health for Hamilton, died July 14, 1969. (age 96)
- Davis, D.S., Stratford. Elected Stratford city council in 1968, chairman of recreation and public service committee, 1970 deputy mayor and chairman of the finance committee, and mayor in 1971. (J.C.D.A. 1971, p. 134)

Denas, F. Murray, (1944) Mayor of Oakville- his 4th year.

Devine, C.J. Elected warden of Ontario County in 1944 (the 1st dentist to be honoured as a county warden) he had had 5 years experience as the reeve of Beaverton.

Dougan, Charles, Councillor in city of Charlottetown, P.E.I. for 16 years.  
(J.C.D.A. 1955, p. 191)

Dubeau, Endore, member of Montreal City Council, under many administrations.  
(J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 339)

Dutton, E.M. (1944) Dryden. Serving his 4th term as mayor, began his public life as a councillor in 1938.

Fauteux, Gaspard. Elected to the provincial legislature in 1931 and in St. Mary's Division (Federal) in 1942. Lt. Governor of Quebec, 1950-58, speaker of the House of Commons, Ottawa, 1945-49. (J.C.D.A. 1945, p. 456-7) Member of the Privy Council. (1963:424)

Fleming, William Andrew, Alliston, Ontario. A municipal councillor from 1921-24.  
(1960, p. 231)

Foster, Selby Evans, Wiarton. Mayor of Wiarton, 1911. (1949: 110)

Frain, James Henry. Town treasurer of Norwich, Ontario for 40 years. (J.C.D.A. 1955, p. 321)

Gibson, E. Elleswoth. Mayor of Elmira for 9 years from 1946. (J.C.D.A. 1955; 429)

Gilford, Wilfred Hyland, Oshawa, Ontario. Entered civic politics in 1939, and won a seat on city council, and served as vice-chairman of the General Purpose Committee. He was re-elected in 1940-41, the latter year as Chairman of the Finance Comm. He served as mayor in 1942, 43 and 45. He retired from council in 1943 and won a seat on the Public Utilities Commission. An active worker for the Liberal party for many years and took part in the work of Oshawa Chamber of Commerce. (1960: 686)

Goodwin, A.H., Edmonton, Alta. Served as mayor of Vegreville 4 times. (1959;317)



Graham, J.A., Goderich. Two terms on the Goderich Town Council. (1958)

Grant, John Ferguson, Durham, Ontario. Served as mayor. (1946, p. 280)

Guest, Edmont T. Toronto. 1932 chairman of Property Committee, 1933 chairman of Finance Committee, and 1934 chairman of the Board of Education, all in Toronto.

Gunn, William Joseph. Reeve of Lancaster, Ontario. (J.D.D.A. 1954, p. 232)

Hamel, Philippe. Member of Parliament for the Province of Quebec, 1935-39. (J.C.D.A. 1952 p. 347) (J.C.D.A. 1954, p. 165)

Hance, Irving L. St. Mary's Ontario. Served on the Town Council for many years. (1947: 614)

Henry, Franklin L., Oshawa. Chairman of Oshawa Parks Commission for 27 years. (1947: 614)

Holmes, G.E., Prince Albert, Sask. Member of Saskatoon City Council for a number of years. (1949)

Holmes, George Harold, Owen Sound. 1938 became Registrar of North Grey. (1949:168)

Honey, Samuel Lee. Served as a Public School Trustee and a member of the town council in Timmins.

Hughes, Frederick George, Waterloo. Member of the Park and Cemetery Board for 35 Years.

Hughes, Sidney James, Tara, Ontario. Member of the Tara School Board 1923-27, 1933-34, Chairman in 1925. Member of the Municipal Council in 1928.

Irvine, Herbert, Lindsay, Ontario (d. 1957). Was a member of the Lindsay Town Council and represented the Council on the Board of Education. (1957: 312)

- Kelly, C.J., Hambourg, N.Y. Graduate of U. of T. Elected chairman of the Lackawana Board of Health. (Oral Health 1934, p. 68)
- Keown, Lorenzo Dow, Moosomin, Sask. Was on the first town council, mayor several times, a member of the School Board for 56 years. (1948:344)
- Kinnear, James Wellington, Belleville. (d. 1957) Alderman, 1929-31, Board of Education 1937-40, and a member of the Library Board. (1958)
- Kirby, Hiram Horton; Born 1883, died 1952. Mayor of Hawkesbury, Ontario: no date given for this. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 180)
- Lantier, Aime, Quebec City. 8 terms as alderman and for several years Director of Finances and leader of the city council.
- Lawson, Gordon Redvers, Representative for Sudbury County in New Brunswick Legislature, 1944-1952. (J.C.D.A. 1954, p. 695)
- Leatherdale, William Boyd, Coldwater, Ontario. Member of the Coldwater Council. (1946: 402)
- Lennox, Charles Oswald. Deputy-Reeve of New Toronto, 1935. (J.C.D.A. 1953, p. 104)
- Lesniak, Joseph, Toronto. Nominated in 1958 as Progressive Conservative candidate for Trinity Riding, but was defeated by the Liberal Candidate, Paul Hellyer. (1959: 39)
- Lewis, Thomas Henry. Member of Jarvis Village council. (J.C.D.A. 1953, p. 565)
- Marshal, Oliver Allinson, Belleville. (d. 1957) Post graduate courses in Orthodontics at Toronto, Montreal and Chicago. Was on the city council and the Board of Education for many years. (1958)
- Matthews, L.F., Swan River, Man. Alderman. 1964 and mayor in 1970 (J.C.D.A. 1970, p. 111) Also served on local hospital board and ambulance committee, regional library committee and Swan River Water and Sewer Utility and Swan River Council.
- McArthur, John Archibald, Markdale, Ontario. Justice of the Peace for the County of Grey, Excouncillor, reeve and member of the High School Board for the Village of Markdale. (1958: 309)

MacDonald, George Harvey. Member of Neepawa Town Council, Manitoba, 1935-43.  
(J.C.D.A. 1953, p. 48)

Mac Donald, Kenneth C. Became Minister of Agriculture in B.C. 1933. Entered the  
Provincial Legislature in 1916) d. 1945. (p. 574)

MacDougall, John Lome, Liberal member of Parliament for Vancouver-Burrard, in  
Ottawa, 1949 and 1953. (J.C.D.A. 1956, p. 501)

McDowell, Frederick William, Barrie. Past president of the North Progressive  
Conservative Association. (1959: 189)

McGuire, George Albert. Minister of Education, Vancouver, B.C. (J.C.D.A. 1955,  
p. 539)

McInnis, Stanley W. Born N.B. In 1899 he was elected to represent Brandon City,  
Man. in the Provincial Legislature. In 1902 he was acting Speaker of the  
Legislature and later became Provincial Secretary and then Minister of Educa-  
tion. (J.C.D.A. 1952, p. 340)

McIntosh, Duncan D., Alexander, Ontario. Served on the Town Council and the Public  
Utilities Commission. Mayor 1941-43. (1960: 448)

McIntyre, Harry Addison. Chairman of Clinton Council's court of Revisions Committee.  
Representative of mayor on the Clinton Public Hospital Board. (J.C.D.A. 1955,  
p. 429)

McKay, William Sargison, Galt. By 1944 he was completing 24 years as a member of  
the Galt City Council and 7 years as mayor. (J.C.D.A. 1956, p. 501)

McKee, Ekdon Clifford. Member of Brighton, Ontario town council. (J.C.D.A. 1955: 591)

McKellar, H.E. On Clearwater, Manitoba town council for 9 years. (J.C.D.A. 1955: 428)

Melanson, Thomas. Member of Yarmouth N.S. town council. (J.C.D.A. 1955, p. 191)

Miller, Gordon James. M.M.P. Toronto. In municipal affairs for many years, serving  
1st on the Board of Education, then as alderman from 1938-1948 when he was  
elected to the Provincial Legislature to represent Riverdale Riding, Toronto.  
(J.C.D.A. 1948, p. 287)

- Mitchell, Joseph Morrison, Collingwood. Member of the Municipal Council 1934-47.
- Moore, C.P. Weyburn council member. Mayor of Weyburn, Ontario. (J.C.D.A. 1956, p. 681)
- Moore, John Howard W. Member of Lacombe, Alta. town council. (J.C.D.A. 1956; 317)
- Morris, Harold Drury. Alderman in Orillia, 1934, deputy reeve, 1935. (J.C.D.A. 1956, p. 50)
- Morrison, Andrew Thomas, Maxville, Ontario. One time reeve of Maxville. (1954: 332)
- Morrison, George. Was elected alderman for Hamilton's Ward I in Jan., 1969.
- Mowry, David Prescott. Served a term on Montreal's City Council. (J.C.D.A. 1955, p. 538)
- Musgrove, George Johnston. Ontario legislature, 1914. Representative for Niagara Falls. (J.C.D.A. 1954, p. 635)
- Nadeau, Emile, Saint Leonard, N.B. Mayor of Saint Leonard in 1939-1944. Ran for office in the Provincial Government, twice; 1935 as Independent and in 1944 as a Conservative. (1958: 309)
- Nash, Clifford Charles, Kingston, Ontario. Former member of Kingston city council and the Board of Education. (1946, P. 244)
- Nolan, B.J., Windsor. Elected president of the Ontario Separate School Trustees Association. 1972.
- Orton, Clarence John, Swift Current, Sask. Past president of the Liberal Assoc. of the Saskatchewan elected district of Swift Current. (1960: 35)
- Parrott, Harry, Woodstock. Ontario Legislature 1971.



Paterson, Thomas Robert, Almonte, Ontario. Member of Board of Education 1907-22. and a member of the town council in 1924.

Perry, R.P. E., Windsor. Member of city council for 18 years and served on the boards of the YMCA and Children's Aid Society. (J.C.D.A. 1970, p. 255)

Price. O.B., West Moreland N.B. Representative in the House of Commons. (1928)

Poag, Art. Was elected a director of the Hamilton Senior Chamber of Commerce for 4 years.

Redden. George Byron, Saltcoats Sask. Served many years on the Board of Trade and the Town Council. (1957: 425)

Reid, A.H. of Arnprior. By 1944 served his 7th term as mayor.

Revell, Richard Leslie (d. 1957) Woodstock, Ontario. Alderman 1910-11 at Woodstock, and chairman of the Board of Park Management for 15 years. (1958)

Robertson, R.S., Cobourg, Ontario. Northumberland P.C. (1959: 189)

Ross, B.R. Former alderman, City of Fredericton. (before 1952)

Schnarr, C. Nelson. Alderman in Kenora, 1912-13. (J.C.D.A. 1953, p. 160)

Seymour, W.M. Mayor of Orillia 1947, alderman 1925-28, 1944, deputy-reeve 1945, reeve 1946.

Shannon, John Adams, Sault Ste Marie. Member of Public School Board, President of The Board of Trade 1913-14, and chairman of the Public Utilities Comm. (J.C.D.A. 1946, p. 420)

Shephard, John William N. Alderman of Kelowna, B.C. (J.C.D.A. 1954, p. 399)

- Sihler, Arthur Theodore, Simcoe, Ontario. 8 years as member of the town council, mayor of Simcoe in 1909, 1911, 1918, 1919. Chairman of the Fire, Water and Light Committee, 1907, and served a number of terms on the Board of Education. (1958)
- Slogan, Joseph, Springfield, Manitoba, Progressive Conservative, 1964.
- Smith, Andrew Gregor, Brantford. Practiced in Regina where he served one year as alderman.
- Sprott, Robert John. Alderman on Simcoe County Council the deputy reeve. 1918-20 as mayor of Barrie. (J.C.D.A. 1956, p. 259)
- Steward, Harry of Kinston. Elected alderman 1932, elected mayor in 1938. Retired from civic office to enter the Ontario Legislative Assembly to which he was elected in 1943.
- Steward, J.S., Lethbridge, Alberta. Elected to the Alberta Legislature in 1911 and remained a member for 14 years. In 1930 he entered Parliament as a Conservative member in the House of Commons for Lethbridge, serving until 1935. (1957: 304-5 and p. 417)
- Trainer, John Clifford, Pugwash, N.S. (d. 1957) Former president of the Board of Trade, twice mayor and served several terms on the town council. (1957: 605)
- Warriner, F.S., Winnipeg. Mayor of Winnipeg. (Oral Health 1937, p. 164)
- White, T.G., Sault Ste Marie. Elected chairman of the Ontario School Trustee Council 1971. Previously trustee on School Board for 11 years and its chairman for 10 years.
- Wickware, Ernest H. Past president of the Smith Falls Liberal Assoc. (C.D.A.J. 1945, p. 464)
- Wing, Ross Hamilton, Ottawa. Served several years as mayor of Guelph. (1949: 110)
- Winn, Robert T., Toronto. Served many years as Justice of the Peace. (1945, p. 523)
- Young, Edward C., Windsor, Ontario. Mayor of Riverside 1939, 1940 and 1944. (1958)
