Receive most articles not available at UofT from other institutions to your email for free

We are delighted to announce a big change in our Interlibrary Loan Services (ILLs): now, most ILLs for journal articles are **free of charge.** And to make it more convenient, these articles can be directly **sent to you via e-mail** (this will save you a trip to Gerstein).

The following is a brief introduction for people who are not familiar with our ILLs: current U of T students, faculty and staff can request items not available at UofT libraries from institutions worldwide via the Interlibrary Loan (ILL) tool - RACER. If you have searched the U of T catalogue and cannot find the items you need, you can:

- * Register for RACER (you do this once) You can get to RACER via the Dentistry Library homepage or use http://onesearch.library.utoronto.ca/ill
- * Log into RACER with your Library barcode and PIN
- * Fill in the Blank Request Form (located at the left side of the page) as completely as possible DELIVERY TIME: The length of time from request to delivery depends on where the material is coming from and how readily available it is. If you request a book, then a trip to Gerstein would be necessary.

Articles that can be delivered electronically are normally available within one or two business days, while books or other items that need to be mailed can take weeks. Be sure to fill out the field "item not needed after" on the RACER request form. You can cancel or check the status of your request in RACER.

- * Items held by UTL, even if in use
- * Reserve or reference items at other libraries

Dental elf - Keep up to date with high quality Evidence Based Dentistry information

Need to keep up to date with the latest important and reliable evidence about the dental practice but don't have the time to manage everything that has been published? Here is the good news: a daily blog to provide brief summaries highlighting evidence-based publications relevant to dental practice in the UK and around the world has been created by Derek Richards, the Director of the Centre for Evidence-based Dentistry, with Douglas Badenoch an Information Scientist. TRIP Database

The latest version of TRIP was released on October 2012. If you aren't familiar with TRIP, it's a free online database designed to provide integrated results from a variety of clinical resources including evidence-based synopses, systematic reviews, guidelines and original articles. TRIP searches several resources, including PubMed, National Guideline Clearinghouse, NICE, and Cochrane etc. The major changes are:

- You can now breakdown the results into the following different categories: Evidence, Images, Videos, Education, Patient Information & News
- PICO search function is now available (search by Patient, Intervention, Comparison & Out-
- Timeline to record your activity on TRIP can be saved as PDF for CPD/CMEH
