



W. J. GIBSON, D.D.S.

Graduated from North Pacific College in Portland, Oregon, 1924.
 After passing the Oregon and B.C. State Dental Boards, he practised dentistry in Victoria, B. C. until the time of his enlistment in World War II, in February, 1940.
 For ten years prior to his enlistment, he was a member of the Board of Dental Examiners for British Columbia.
 He is Past President of the B. C. Dental Association, and the Victoria Dental Society.
 Has presented many clinics in Operative Dentistry and Oral Surgery before the American Dental Association, the Western Canada Dental Society, and various provincial, state and local societies.
 He was a Charter member of the Vancouver Ferrier Gold Foil Club, and the Dr. Argue Porcelain Study Club of Seattle, Washington.
 World War 2: Appointed to the rank of Lieutenant in January, 1940. Received his Captaincy in March, 1940, and to Major in May, 1942. He served as Adjutant of No. 37 Coy., C.D.C. (R.C.A.F.) from April, 1941 to May, 1942, and as Officer in charge of the Dental clinic at Victoria. He was appointed Officer Commanding No. 36 Coy., C.D.C. (R.C.A.F.) at Toronto, in June, 1943 until he was made Officer Commanding the Canadian Dental Corps Technical Training Centre at Toronto, Ontario, in 1944.
 He was a keen golfer, and a member of the hole-in-one club.
 While in Toronto, he contributed to the program of the Ontario Dental Association Conventions..
 He died December 28th, 1945.
