



EDMUND ALEXANDER GRANT, D.D.S., F.A.C.D.

Born in Toronto, July 11th, 1883, son of Edmund Alexander and Ada Jane Grant.

Educated in Toronto and graduated from R.C.D.S. in 1906. He served in World War I and was in charge of Dental Services at Valcartier and at Braunschott Camp, England and was later attached to the 11th Canadian Field Ambulance in France.

In 1921, he was appointed part-time Director of Dental Services in the Dept. of Health in Toronto, & in 1945 he became Full-time Director.

He is Associate Professor of Public Health (Dentistry) at the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto & a member of the Canadian Dental Research Foundation (Associate Sec. Treas. in 1941)

In 1941-42, he was President of the Ontario Dental

Association, and President of the Toronto
Academy of Dentistry 1933-34.

From 1920-24 he was Secretary-Treasurer of the
Canadian Dental Association, and in 1941, Sec-
Treasurer of the Canadian Dental Hygiene Council.

He is a member of the United Church, the A.F. & A.M.
& the Lions Club of Toronto, of which he was
President in 1939.

In 1947 he was honoured by a Fellowship in the
American College of Dentists.

He, with Dr Bothwell & others formed a Dental Alumni
Assoc., of which he was President in 1947.

In June 1958: an Honorary Life membership in the
O.D.A. was conferred.
