Went West and resided in each of the Western Provinces.

World War 1: Went from Winnipeg in 1916, and was commissioned with the 44th Infantry in France. He was selected on the field for Officers Training, and was sent to Bexhill in England.

After the war, he came to the Royal College of Dental Surgeons, in Toronto and graduated from there in 1923.

Upon graduation, he commenced practice at Timmins, Ontario.

He served as a Public School Trustee and a member of the town Council.

Past President and Charter member of the Timmins Kiwanis Club.

He is an active member of the Masonic Order.

Represented Northern Ontario at the Ontario Dental Association and in 1942-1943, Became its President.

In 1944 he came to Toronto after completing a course in French at McGill University, Montreal, and received his B.Sc.(Dent.) in and his D.D.P.H. from the School of Hygiene, University of Toronto in 1946?

From 1947 on he was in the Welland-Crowland Health Clinic where the Red Cross (Ont. Division) sponsored a dental health Education project. Became editor of the Journal of the Ontario Dental Association in 1948.
