

GUY G. HUME, 1874-1929

Born in Galt, Ontario in 1874.

Educated at Galt Collegiate Institute first, and then graduated from the Royal College of Dental Surgeons in 1897, after which he practised Orthodontia in Toronto.

While at High School, he distinguished himself in football and hockey, and at University, he was on the football team.

In 1900, he was appointed assistant demonstrator of operative and prosthetic dentistry in the Royal College of Dental Surgeons. He held this position until 1907, when he was appointed Professor of Orthodontia until his death in 1929.

In 1906, he took the course at the Angle School of Orthodontia.

He was the first Specialist in Orthodontia in Toronto, and in 1906, he became a partner of Dr. Arthur Roberts, who died shortly afterwards.

In 1914, he was elected President of the American Society of Orthodontists - the First Canadian to hold this position.

When war broke out, he joined the Canadian Army and was placed in charge of the Canadian Army Dental Corps at Niagara Camp. He went overseas in 1916 - where he was known for his treatment of injuries of the jaws. He had charge of the Dept. treating jaw fractures at Orpington Hospital, England. He was mentioned in despatches, and in 1918, he was recalled to America for post-graduate work on jaw injuries to the American and Canadian dental officers. He retired from the Army as Lieutenant Colonel.

He was a member of the Lambton Golf Club.

He died in 1929.
