



THOMAS HARRY HUTCHINSON, D.D.S.

Born at Eversley, Ontario on February 21, 1896.

Attended Public and High Schools at Aurora, Ontario, then went to Woodstock Collegiate from which he matriculated in 1913, He then enrolled in the Royal College of Dental Surgeons with the class of 1916, but enlisted in the First World War for two years, resuming his studies to graduate in 1918.

Activities: Has served as President of his local dental society for three terms; President of the Thunder Bay Musical Festival Board, 1948; a member of the Y.M.C.A. Board of Directors; a member of the Port Arthur School Board; President of the Gyro Club; Chairman of the Welcome Home and Reception Committee of the City's rehabilitation for troops and war brides, and Church Deacon and Sunday School teacher of 'teen-age boys.

Participates as well in the St. John's Ambulance Corps Activities: President of the local St. John's Ambulance Association, 1948, and District Superintendent of St. John's Ambulance Brigade for the Lake Superior District. In 1947, he was summoned to Ottawa and invested Officer Brother, Order of St. John.

He is married, with two children: a son who graduated from McMaster University and the University of Manitoba, and served as a Medical Officer during the second World War; and a daughter who is a graduate of Victoria College, University of Toronto, and now demonstrator in biology at the University of British Columbia.
