JOSEPH HARKER JOHNSON, D. D. S.

Born in Dunmanway, County Cork, Ireland.

Went to Beresford, Manitoba. Received his Pass and Honour Matriculation at Brandon, Manitoba.

Graduated from the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario in 1925. While at the University, he was a reporter for the "Varsity" and a member of the Psi Omega Fraternity.

In 1930, he was appointed Demonstrator in the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto, was made an Associate in 1931, Assistant Professor in 1935, and in 1945 became Professor of Dental Surgery and Head of the Department.

During the years 1925-1930, he was in general practice.

In 1948, he was made a member of the University Senate.

He was Secretary of the Academy of Dentistry from 1946-1947, and its President, 1948-1949. He was Chairman of the Fellowship Committee, 1946-1947, member of the Ontario Society of Dental Oral Surgeons, Chairman of the Winter Clinic, Academy of Dentistry, 1947-1948.

He has attained membership in the following Societies: Ontario Dental Association (of which he was President from 1953-1954), Canadian Dental Association, International Anaesthesia Research Association, Federation Dentaire Nationale, Ontario Society of Dental Oral Surgeons, Great Lakes Society of Oral Surgeons; he is an Honorary member of the Chicago Dental Society. Was a member of the American Society of Anesthesiologists for about 16 years, and a member of the York Historical Society.

He was examiner for the Dominion Dental Council in Oral Surgery, and a member of the Board of Governors of the Ontario Dental Assoc.

He was Associate Editor of the Journal of Oral Surgery, and is now Editor of Oral Health. He is Librarian of the Dental Library, Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto.

In March of 1954, he was awarded the Thomas P. Hinman medallion for outstanding services in the field of dentistry.

He has given papers and clinics before all local dental societies in Ontario and most of the United States.

He is a member of the Masonic Order, of Psi Omega Fraternity, and of the Victoria Club.

His hobbies are woodworking, metalworking and Horticulture.
