



LEE ALBERT KILBURN.

Born July 27, 1898, in Fredericton, N. B.

Matriculated at Fredericton High School in 1915, and from the University of New Brunswick, 1915-196.

In World War I, he enlisted in the 9th Seige Battery and served in Great Britain, France and Belgium.

On his return, he entered the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto, where he graduated in in 1923, after which he practised in Hamilton, Ontario.

For a number of years, in addition to his private practise, he was part-time dental surgeon with the old Département of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, and he carried on with his work after the Department of Pensions and National Welfare was set up.

For 5 years, from 1937 until his appointment with the Canadian Dental Corps, in World War II, he was a professor on the staff of the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto.

In 1944, he was Officer Commanding, No.26 Coy, C.D.C., with H.Q. in Halifax, as Major, then he was District Supervising Dentist at the Hamilton office of the Dept. of Veteran's Affairs. In 1948, he was appointed Director of Dental Services for the Dept. of Veteran's Affairs, attached to Head Office, Ottawa.

He was President of the Hamilton Dental Society in 1931, served for several years as a member of the Board of Governors, Ontario Dental Association.
