

ARCHIBALD CLIFFORD LEWIS, M.A., D. Paed.

Received his early education at Strathroy, Ontario, where he attended the Collegiate.

He received his B. A. in 1915, and his M. A. in 1920 from the University of Toronto.

In World War I: Went overseas as a gunner with the 14th Battery C.F.A. to France 1915-1917. He was wounded in France and won his Commission as a Lieut. with the 24th Battery C.F.A., France, 1917-1918. He was also an Adjutant with the 8th Army Brigade C.F.A., France, 1918-1919. He was mentioned in despatches in 1918.

He returned in 1920 to teach at the Royal Military College in Kingston.

In 1922, he entered the College of Education for one year.

In 1924, he joined the staff at Malvern Collegiate, and in 1928, he came to the University of Toronto Schools to the Science Department, where he remained until 1930 when he was offered the Principalship of East York Collegiate. In 1934, he became Headmaster of University of Toronto Schools, in which position he remained until 1944, when he became Dean of the Ontario College of Education.

In 1936, he was President of the Ontario School Teachers' Federation, and in 1937, he was President of the Canadian Teachers' Federation.

He was a Delegate to the UNESCO Seminar on Education and Training of Teachers at Ashbridge, England in 1948.

He was also a member of UNESCO Consultative Educational Mission to the Phillipines in 1949.

He has been Chairman of the Survey Committee of the Canadian Dental Association since 1950.

He is married and has four children: 3 girls and 1 boy, all married.
