



FRANK MELVILLE LOTT, D.D.S., M.Sc., Ph.D., F.I.C.D., C.B.E.

Born at Uxbridge, Ontario, in 1896, where he received his early education. Graduated from the University of Toronto in 1923, after serving in the Great War of 1914-1918 as Lieutenant in the First Divisional Signal Coy.

In private practice until 1928, ^{in Detroit & Sarvia} when he joined the staff of the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto. He became Professor of Prosthetic Dentistry in 1931, which position he held until his appointment Sept. 1, 1939 as Director of Dental Services and Officer administrating the Canadian Dental Corps.

Received his Doctor of Philosophy Degree in 1940 for his thesis:
"Proposed Dental Service for the Defence Forces of Canada"

He spent ten and a half months in the United Kingdom engaged on inspection and further organization of the dental services in army, navy and air force.

Promoted to Brigadier in 1943.

Resigned from the Active Canadian Forces Jan. 31, 1946, but remains on the nominal roll of the Reserve Army.

In 1946, he became Director of Professional Research in the Research Division of the Dentist's Supply Company of New York.

He is a member of the National Society of Dental Prosthetists., Ont. Dental Association & Toronto Academy of Dentistry.
Began research in the use of glass as a denture base, in 1927, and succeeded in producing a suitable product, and developing a technique for using it, in 1937.

Chief hobbies are photography, cabinet making, & fishing

In 1930 received his B.Sc. (Dent.), M.Sc. (Dent) in 1936,

1949. Appointed head of the Dept. of Prosth. U. of S. Calif. Dental School.
