



HUGH RICHARD MacLAREN, D.D.S. D.D.P.H.

Appointed as Dental Public Health officer of the Board of Health, Windsor, 1946 to act as director of dental services and promote the educational program for the city schools of Windsor.

Prior to World War I, he was on the staff of the Public Health Service for the Province of Ontario.

Attached to the 5th Field Ambulance at Hamilton went overseas in 1939 with this unit as Dental officer.

Served during the Battle of Britain, and at the reorganization of Dental Services in England he was attached to the 1st Divisional Co. of the C.D.C.

Went to North Africa, Sicily & Italy.

Upon return home, he took the Public Health Course at the School of Hygiene, U. of T.

Member of the Central Dental Public Health Committee of the O.D.A. as Chairman of the Materials Committee was

responsible for new publications being prepared for D.P.H. work.
Appointed Assistant Chief, Dental Health Division, Dept. of Nat.
Health and Welfare.

Graduated from U. of T. in 1936, and practised in Campbellford
for two years. Spent 18 months in P.H. dentistry as senior
dental officer in the hospital division of the Ont. Dept.
of Health, leaving for war service overseas with the C.D.G.
after the war served a year as associate field secretary
of the Canadian Dental Hygiene Council and later as Dental
Health officer and assistant to the medical health officer in
Windsor.
