

JOHN OPPIE McCALL, B.A., D.D.S., F.A.C.D.

Born October 4, 1879 in Geneva, N.Y.

Received his B.A. at Yale University, New York, in 1901, and his D.D.S. from the University of Buffalo in 1904.

Formerly Professor of Oral Hygiene and Periodontics at the University of Buffalo, 1910-19; Instructor in Periodontia at Columbia University, 1917-23; visiting lecturer in Periodontia, New York University College of Dentistry; Associate in Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Cornell University College of Medicine.

He is consultant to the Dental Services, New York Hospital.

Former Lieutenant-Commander (Dental Corps) United States Naval Reserve.

In 1947, he retired as Director of the Murray and Leonie Guggenheim Dental Clinic, New York. He had been in this position since 1929, shortly after it was founded.

He was Founder and Past President of the American Academy of Periodontology.

He was a member of: The National Dental Association, New York State Dental Society and the Eighth District Dental Society of N.Y.

With Paul R. Stillman, he was co-author of the "Textbook of Clinical Periodontia" first published in 1922.

He was the inventor of pyorrhea scalers and holding instruments for sharpening them.
