



RICHARD HAMILTON McDOUGALL, D.D.S., L.D.S., M.M.

Born in Staffa, Ontario, July 16, 1898.

Moved to Boharm, Sask in 1909. Graduated from Moose Jaw Collegiate in 1916, and Regina Normal School in 1917.

World War I: Went overseas with the Queen's University Battalion, and served in France with the 20th Battalion, B. E.F., was awarded the Military Medal, and was wounded in August, 1918.

He maintained connection with the Canadian Militia as Dental Officer in the 10th Field Ambulance, R.C.A.M.C. from 1929-1937.

He graduated from the Royal College of Dental Surgeons in 1923, and practised dentistry in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan until 1937, when he moved to Victoria, B. C.

In December, 1939, he was appointed Command Dental Officer, Western Air Command, and in August, 1941, was posted to No.40 Company, Canadian Dental Corps, No.4 Training Command as Command Dental Officer. He was Made Lieut.-Col. in 1942.

He is Past President of the Moose Jaw Dental Society. He re-organized the Saskatchewan Dental Society in 1936, and was General Chairman of the first convention held under the new organization in the same year.
