JOHN EARL MOSER, D. D. S.

Born at Blyth, Ontario, August 4, 1905.

Graduated from the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto in 1930. During his college years, he participated in Swimming, Interfaculty Water Polo, was a "D" holder, and had parts in Dentantics.

He practiced in Hamilton, Ontario, for 12 years before coming to Toronto.

In 1948, he was appointed Demonstrator in dentistry in the Department of Radiology of the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto.

This same year, he enrolled at the University of California to spend a year studying under the direction of Dr. G. M. Fitzgerald, Director of Continuation Studies there. This was on a W. K. Kellogg Foundation Scholarship.

He returned to the Faculty of Dentistry in 1949, when he was made an Associate, and in 1950 he took a Post-Graduate Course in Oral Diagnosis and Roentgenology at the University of Pennsylvania, under the direction of Dr. LeRoy Ennis and Dr. Lester W. Burket. In July, 1950, he was given the rank of Associate Professor.

In 1951, he started a practice limited to Radiology, on St. Clair A ve., Toronto, with Dr. R. E. Diprose, Dr. O. J. Yule and Dr. R. E. Moyers.

In September 1954, he was promoted from Associate Professor and Head of the Department of Radiology, to Professor. In this, he continued a full-time appointment, carrying on his practice 2 half days a week.

He has given extramural lectures at Renfrew, Peterborough, Brantford, Timmins, Kirkland Lake, North Bay, Sudbury, Sault Ste. Marie, Port Arthur, Oakville, and Kingston, and has conducted numerous continuation courses at the Faculty of Dentistry.

He was a member of the Ontario Dental Association and past president and charter member of the Toronto Radiodontic Study Group.

He spent his summers in Temagami, where he had a store.

He died on Saturday, January 29, 1955, at the age of 49, at Chattanooga, Tennessee. He leaves his wife, Lesley, and two children, Kenneth and Patsy.
