

JOHN ALFRED NATTRESS, D. D. S.

Born in Woodbridge, Ontario, September 6, 1895.

Moved to Sault Ste. Marie, where he received his matriculation in 1911

He served for three-years during World War I with the Canadian
Field Artillery. He was with the Sault Ste Marie
and Sudbury Regiment (M.G.) from 1925 until 1939
during which time he was promoted to Major. The
unit was called for active service in September,
1939, and in February, 1940, he transferred to the
Canadian Dental Corps with the rank of Captain.

He opened the dental Clinic at the R. C. A. F. station, Trenton, while serving with No. 36 Co'y, C.D.G. (R.C.A.F.)

No. I Training Command and was officer in charge.

In 1940, he was posted to C.D.C. H.Q. at Ottawa where he was until 1943 when he was appointed Command Dental Officer, No.I Training Command, R.C.A.F., as Lt.-Col.

He has served as President of the Sault Ste Marie Dental Society and is Past Master of Algoma Lodge, A.F. & A.M. He practised dentaistry at Sualt Ste Marie.
