

2022 marks the 125th anniversary of the Dentistry Library. The Royal College of Dental Surgeons (the former name of the Faculty of Dentistry) set up a library in 1897 at the former faculty building at 230 College Street. The library was set up with a few key textbooks to support its students, staff, and faculty with their teaching and learning. We moved to our current location at 124 Edward Street in 1959, and over the years, the library has transformed its collections, spaces and services to reflect the changing needs of its users. Today, it includes over 30,000 print items, online journals, ebooks, online medical dictionaries, finding aids, guides, databases and more. All of these can be accessed or discovered on our website. The library is part of the University of Toronto Libraries system, which is the third largest academic library system in North America. It is also the only free-standing and largest dentistry library in Canada. To commemorate this milestone, the following have been organized:
