



Gordon Benjamin Shillington, D. D. S.

Graduated from The Royal College of D. Surgeons in 1934, then spent a year on post-graduate work at The Forsyth Dental Infirmary at Boston, Mass., then two years teaching at the University of Toronto in the Departments of Dental Anatomy and Preventive Dentistry, also doing post graduate work from which he received his B.Sc (Dent.) degree

He practised in Toronto until the outbreak of war, then joined the C. D. C. on Nov. 6, 1939 & went overseas in June, 1940. Until Dec., 1942, he was with various Army units in the first and second divisions in England & was promoted to the rank of Major in June, 1942. In Dec., 1942, he was transferred to No. 18 Can. Base Dent. Coy (R. C. A. F.) & proceeded to the Middle East where he worked most of the time at R. C. A. F., D. H. Q., Cairo until May, 1944. He was promoted Lt.-Col. & appointed to command No. 20. Can. Base Dent. Coy. as of Oct. 17, 1944.
