



ERMAND FRANCIS STEWART, D.D.S.

Born in Orillia, Ontario, in 1898, where he received his early education. After matriculating in 1916, he went to Europe. On his return, he entered the Royal College of Dental Surgeons, Toronto, and graduated in 1923. After graduation, he took post-graduate work at Rochester, New York, and then a term as resident dentist at the Muskoka Hospital at Gravenhurst. He then practised in Toronto, and finally moved to Creemore in the fall of 1937.

In World War 1, he served overseas in England and France with the Canadian Field Artillery from 1916-1919.

In World War 2, he was appointed to the Canadian Dental Corps in January, 1940, promoted to the rank of Major in 1942, and to Lt.-Col. in 1944. He was stationed at Canadian Dental Corps H. Q. at Ottawa from May, 1941 after being stationed with No. 36 Co'y C.D.C. (R.C.A.F.), No. 1 Training Command, Toronto, Ontario. In 1944, he was made Assistant Director of Dental Services, C.D.C. H.Q. at Ottawa.

He now resides in Ottawa, and his hobby is his interest in the propagation of upland game birds. While in Creemore, Ontario, he was a member of the Creemore branch of the Canadian Progress Club.
