



LLOYD ALEXANDER STIRLING, D.D.S.

Born in Hancock, Michigan, on June 16, 1899. *Died; August 1959*

A year later, he went to Kincardine, Ontario, where he received his matriculation in 1915.

He enlisted in February, 1916 in the 160th Battalion. Served in France with the 2nd Canadian Pioneers, and the 6th Canadian Engineers. He returned to Canada in May, 1919, and entered the Royal College of Dental Surgeons, Toronto, from which he graduated in 1923, and set up practise in Toronto.

He was appointed to the Canadian Dental Corps in June, 1940, promoted to Major in 1941, serving with No. 1 Training Command Headquarters (R.C.A.F.), Toronto, and as assistant to the Deputy Director of Dental Services (R.C.A.F.) Ottawa. In 1944, he was promoted to the rank of Lieut.-Col. and to District Dental Officer of M.D.2.
