

CECIL LESLIE STRACHAN

Born Sept. 5, 1898 at Hamiota, Manitoba.

Received his public and high school education at Hamiota "receiving the maximum of benefit with the minimum of effort" (Torontonensis)

Graduated in Arts from Brandon College.

Served with the R. A. F.

Graduated from the Royal College of Dental Surgeons in 1924.

He was Vice-President of the Western Club, 1921-1922, a member of the Oriental Club, and the Xi Psi Phi Fraternity.

He also served with the Armed services during World War II as a member of a team of instructors to the officers of several dental companies. Later he became Commanding Officer, 1st Res.
