

WILLIAM GLENN TRELFORD, V.D., D.D.S.

Graduated from R. C.D.S. in 1913.

He joined the Canadian Dental Corps on its formation, and was the second officer posted to M.D.2. In December, 1915, he was appointed Assistant Director of Dental Services of that District, but relinquished that appointment to serve overseas with Dr. Guy Hume in the dental treatment of jaw injuries. He proceeded to France early in 1917, and served there until the end of the war in 1919.

He returned to Canada in 1919, and became associated with the late Professor W. E. Cummer in a special clinic for jaw injury cases. He joined the staff of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons as a demonstrator from 1919-1929. Later he became Associate Professor of Periodontology under Dr. H. K. Box. At the same time, he remained in the Army Service, and by 1930, he was Senior Dental Officer of M.D.2.

At the beginning of World War 2, he was appointed District Dental Officer, M.D.2 with the rank of Lt.Col. He accepted a reduction in rank to Major to take command of the 1st Divisional Dental Co. that proceeded overseas in December, 1939. In August, 1940, he reported to, Canadian Military H.Q. in London as A.D.D.S. as Lt.Col once more. Here he had the administration of the entire overseas Tanadian Dental Service for army, navy, and Air force, was Dental advisor to C.M.H.Q., and had direct command of Intermediate overseas base. In 1942, he was appointed A.D.D.S. Canadian Reinforcement Units. He also received the Coronation Decoration.

Dr. Trelford has presented papers and clinics in Ontario, the United States,

and before the American Dental Society of Europe at Amsterdam. He was President of the Toronto Central Dental Society, was a member of the Board of Governors of the Ontario Dental Association, and in 1939 was President of the Toronto Academy of Dentistry. From 1935-1937, he was Archivist and Historian of the Ontario Dental Association.
